Fire / EMS Report:

This has been a busy month for the training division. We started the month with 6 personnel taking written promotional exams. Afterward the division moved to the practical exams with oral review boards completing the process. So far 3 of the personnel have completed the process with the remaining 3 finishing in the first week of May. Also this month SMFR crews worked with our new business partners EVO Gymnastics. Crews toured the facility and also completed a simulated injury with extrication from a pit. Crews continue to complete monthly CEU classes to renew their EMS certifications as well as their fire certifications. Finally this month the crews had a meeting with our business partner Columbia Southern University. A representative from the university met with crews and discussed the process to complete a degree in fire science.

Special Operations Report:

The main course of instruction this month of April was all SMFR personnel on hazardous materials acid and base titration. This to topic dealt with how we as responders operate in these incidents and assist other departments and private business on mid- size spills. The class participated in classroom lecture and hands on skills stations where they took an actual acid and base and turned that product back into water. This was done by converting the product with a reactionary acid and base and converting the product back to a safe condition.

Miscellaneous:

Post Incident Analysis was completed by training on the Cortec Haz-Mat Incident.

All Radiation equipment was calibrated and serviced by Training Haz-Mat Captain.

Captain Thayer & Captain Bloski met with Pierce Manufacturing. We set-up a 3 month program of facility touring, classroom sessions on confined spaces, and finally a drill to occur in July 2017.

B/C Gould, Captain Thayer, & Captain Bloski all participated in the annual Hurricane drill for 2017.

Captain Thayer & Firefighter Ranney completed a CPR / First Aid class with our business partners Robins Apartments. 8 Personnel were certified.

Captain Bloski is working on making SMF a state deployment Haz-Mat team.
