

SMFR Special Operations Training Report August 2018

The month of August was a return to outside training with SMFR hazmat techs. training on LPG incidents. With a new policy that will be emerging in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarters, crews trained on LPG container identification and flare off using our Orange Dragon. This training was also required of the 5 new SMFR hazmat techs as part of their initial training. This training was conducted at Suburban Propane at no cost to the district.

## Other topics and issues handled in August:

- The new hazmat technician class wrapped up instruction with the 5 new SMFR techs completing an average of 200 hours. SMFR has filed paperwork and task books to the state for these 5 to take the written exam for certification as Florida Hazardous Materials Technicians by Sept. 31<sup>st</sup>.
- BC Gould and Capt. Bloski were asked to address the Manatee County Fire Operations committee in regards to drafting a county MCROG of hazmat response. Two drafts were prepared and sent to the committee with continued discussion on refining the policy to fit all departments needs in the county.
- Over 11 new SMFR directives were finished and sent to DC Blanco and the directives review committee. These directives were needed for the upcoming SERC audit that will take place in Sept. 2018. These are new technician level directives on procedures that SMFR special operations may conduct on hazmat scenes.
- SMFR Hazmat Interlocal agreement was revised to meet the Manatee County Fire Chief's request. Please see the Chief's report for more information.
- A proposal was sent to the state Emergency Management on acquiring radiation detection equipment under a new federal grant. The was sent to the state on August 10 and we are awaiting word.
- Capt. Bloski and FF McKeaver attended the Center of Domestic Preparedness to attend the Hazardous Materials Evidence collection course in a week long course. This course was brought back to SMFR and training was passed on to SMFR members in September.
- BC Gould and Capt. Bloski attended the local LEPC meeting and began to prepare for the SERC audit and requested 2019 training classes that will be held at SMFR.
- Capt. Bloski picked up over 2,500 Level B and C PPE from the state surplus warehouse. These were declared surplus and these will be used for future trainings and placed on the new Decon Trailer.
- Hazmat Squad 328 crews participated in a walk-though of Sysco plant in Palmetto, Florida as part of a new outreach program to look at specific target hazards for hazmat response in the county.
- BC Gould and Capt. Bloski attended the Regional Security Task Force Hazmat meeting to discuss regional security issues on August 28<sup>th</sup>.
- A Post Incident Analysis meeting was held with NRFD BC Miller in regards to the Port of Manatee Incident. This will be the first live PIA meeting broadcasted on Sept. 5 to the entire county.
