

SMFR Special Operations Training Report
July 2020



For the month of July 2020, SMFR still remains under Covid-19 training restrictions. With this in mind, we conducted on-line web based for county fire service personnel dealing with a review of over the road Department of Transportation vehicles and containers. Capt. Blosski conducted a 2.5-hour meeting with SMFR personnel along with North River Fire District and the City of Bradenton Fire Department to review basic construction, safety, and response concerns. Other trainings were conducted with hazmat technicians in small group in stations to continue knowledge, skills, and abilities.

Other topics and issues handled in July:

- New sample kit packaging placed into service on HZ-328. This replaced the older style kit and easier to organize supplies.
- Communicated and responded with FEMA regarding follow-up questions regarding 2020 AFG Covid Grant.
- Manatee County Threat and Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment completed and sent to Manatee County Emergency Management as part of annual review.
- Created press release for July 8, 2020 mutual aid response to the United State Food & Drug Administration search warrant conducted in the Manatee County area. Cost recovery packet sent to USFDA for cost incurred in our response.
- Payment received for the 2020 SMFR Hazmat Technician school for \$2,538.36 from Tampa Bay LEPC
- Research conducted on new technology dealing with biological detection within the hazmat team.
- Research into Florida moving towards FEMA Hazmat Team Typing, looking at equipment needed, and we meet and exceed FEMA standards.
- Reviewed and ordered a memorial plaque to be installed next to Administration 9/11 memorial. This was an exhaustive effort by all SMFR personnel to find fitting verbiage to honor that date.
- On July 27th, participated in interview with National Security Directorate (American Society of Testing & Materials) about our response to Fentanyl related calls. In a 50 min interview, they we discussed case studies, testing procedures, and protocols. They will publish a paper later in the year focused on first responder's response and best practices. This a national study.
